Description of the enigma

This enigma provides examples of songs with different forms of conditionals and text to fill according to the lyrics. Once the students fill the sentences, they have to count the number of letters which will give them a code.

You can even use all 4 songs and create a longer code with all the answers put together!

Enigma: how many letters in the word that is repeated?

Zero conditional: 'Rain' by The Beatles

Answer: reads = 5





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First conditional: 'Bad Guy' by Billie Eilish

Answer: reads = 5

Second conditional: 'Grenade' by Bruno Mars

'Oh, oh, I _____ go through all this pain

Take a bullet straight through my brain

Yes, I _____ die for ya, baby

But you _____ do the same

Answer: would, would, won't = 14

Third conditional: 'Should've Said No' by Taylor Swift

"You should've ______ that word, about what you did with her, ______ get

back to me"

Answer: known, would = 10





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Hints

If players find the correct word but not the correct number, tell them to count the number of characters they had to write.

More information

Possible restrictions

Students with **hearing impairments** could have trouble to understand part of the lyrics. If the majority of your players have hearing impairments, this enigma could block the experience.

Other usages

Also, you could use this enigma as a reading comprehension where players would have to find the conditional verbs and count the letters.





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
