## The enigma

• Keywords

The participants are given a text containing some types of modal verbs. They have the task to choose the correct answers and calculate the total of their answers. The code is the multiplication of 7 (How many dwarfs are there in the Snow White's story?) by 9 (How many months does normally a human pregnancy last?), namely 63. If they do not obtain this number as a result, there might be one / more wrong answers.

#### • Description of the enigma

#### Your polling station

First you (1) are supposed to / have to find out where your polling station is. If you don't know this information, go to your local town hall. They (2) will be able / are able to inform you of where you (3) need / must to go to vote.

#### On the way

When you arrive at the polling station, staff will give you a ballot paper listing the candidates you (4) have to / can vote for. You (5) may / shall be given more than one ballot paper if there are several elections taking place on the same day.

#### In the polling booth

Take your ballot paper into the closed booth so nobody (6) can / must see how you vote. Mark your ballot paper according to the instructions – you (7) will / may use a blue or black pen, but you (8) couldn't / mustn't use a pencil. You (9) needn't / ought not to take a pen with you as you will find one in the polling booth.

#### Into the ballot box

Then you (10) must / shall fold your paper in half, show it to the election official and drop it into the ballot box.
